ABOUT THE PUNK The Punk Rock Museum is the world's most comprehensive **ROCK MUSEUM:** attraction dedicated to the history, culture and absurdity of Rock 'n' Roll's bastard stepchild. Located in Las Vegas, it houses not only artifacts and memorabilia from across the scene—such world's punk as handwritten lvrics. instruments, clothing, photos, flyers and artwork-but also a bar, tattoo parlor, wedding/wake chapel, punk merch shop, performance space and more. Encompassing 12,000 square feet between the Las Vegas Strip and Downtown, the museum celebrates the genre's substantial cultural impact over the last half-century.

ABOUT THE PUNK COLLECTIVE: The Punk Rock Museum began when Mike "Fat Mike" Burkett of the American punk rock band NOFX was bouncing around the idea of opening a punk rock store with a bunch of friends, including former Warped Tour manager Lisa Brownlee. Quickly, the idea grew, and Burkett put together a group including Pennywise guitarist Fletcher Dragge, Bryan Ray Turcotte, Vinnie Fiorello and hundreds of like-minded musicians and industry professionals who became the Punk Collective.

THE COLLECTION: The Punk Rock Museum houses the world's most expansive, inclusive and intimate display of artifacts, photos, clothing, instruments, handwritten lyrics artwork and just about everything else donated by the people and bands who were there. Guests can view extraordinary pieces, such as Debbie Harry's iconic Vultures T-shirt recreated by New York City punk artist Scooter Laforge circa 2021, Johnny Thunders' 1959 guitar, the molds for the Devo helmets, DC Scream's amp form the "Faith/Void" cover, the chainsaw Sum 41 used to kick off their shows during the Does This Look Infected tour, FEAR's saxophone, an entire outfit from the Interrupters' Aimee Allen and other well-used-and-abused objects from their favorite artists. In addition to celebrating famous punk bands, the museum also displays artifacts from any punk band that has ever been on a flyer, played in a

- **GUIDED TOURS:** The Punk Rock Museum also offers guided tours directly from the legends of punk rock. Visitors can look forward to hearing about the first Germs shows from Don Bolles, walk with Roger Miret from Agnostic Front as he tells them about living in a van in the Lower East Side in the early 80s and hear about the crazy meteoric rise to fame from Noodles with The Offspring. Everyone who books one of these tours will hear stories no one else has heard from the people who lived them.

Guided tours will be offered multiple times throughout the day and capacity is limited to 20 people per tour.

- THE TRIPLE DOWN: The Punk Rock Museum also houses the Triple Down bar, co-managed by Las Vegas punk legend P Moss. The Triple Down takes its inspiration from Moss' famous Double Down Saloon in Las Vegas and the Triple Rock Social Club, the former Minneapolis punk bar, music venue and restaurant, co-owned by Gretchen Funk and Erik Funk of punk band Dillinger Four. As a punk landmark, the Triple Rock Social Club has been featured in a number of punk songs and music videos, including "Seeing Double At The Triple Rock" by NOFX.
- **TATTOO PARLOR:** In true punk rock fashion, the museum features an authentic tattoo parlor complete with professional artists.
- JAM ROOM: Punk fans are invited to visit the museum's Jam Room, where they can play real guitars and basses owned by artists using their actual amps. Artists whose instruments and amps are featured in this room include Rise Against, NOFX, Pennywise, Sick of it All, Strung Out and many more.
